## NATIONAL DEAF CURLING CHAMPIONS

This past season saw another championship for Quebec at the National Deaf Curling championships. Building on their success of GOLD at the Deaf Olympics, Team Quebec breezed through the round robin and the

playoffs and captured the GOLD once again in the nationals. Here's the report taken from the Glenmore Forum from Rahul Majumdar, coach for Team Quebec:

*Hi everyone,*

*Well folks, Quebec is definitely on top of the deaf curling world, as a result of a 6-2 (9 ends) victory over Manitoba earlier today at the Canadian Deaf Curling Championships (CDCC).*

*Team Raby used the opening hammer to take a 2-0 lead and never looked back. The early ends were mostly open, as Manitoba could only manage a single point in three hammer ends.*

*Up 3-1 after 5 ends, Quebec (8-1) used a strong hitting game to limit scoring opportunities for its opponents. After exchanging singles, both the eighth and ninth ends involved many rocks in play.*

*Manitoba (7-3) was forced into difficult runbacks and draws to score. By controlling the central zone, Team Raby was able to steal consecutive singles - including the sixth point which forced Manitoba skip Ross Lavallee to concede.*

*Team Quebec's goals for CDCC 2007 were all met. The team (Mike Raby, André Guillemette, Damian Hum, David Joseph) can now claim to have had the greatest year in deaf curling history:*

- Back-to-back CDCC championships.*
- First ever Winter Deaflympics gold medal (Non-official).*

*Now, it is time to relax (Finally 😊), savour a job well done, and look forward to Edmonton for CDCC 2008. Next year's event will serve as the trials for the*

*first ever Deaf Curling World Championships.*
